FROM THE OFFICE OF PRINCIPAL TOM GWIN

On Monday, April 22, the Board of Selectmen approved an override question that would establish a stabilization fund to upgrade the technology infrastructure for the school district and also the municipal government. The override question will be on the ballot of the United States Senate special election on June 25. If the override passes, Winchester taxpayers would pay a total of \$350,000 in FY2014 to initiate the stabilization fund. The amount generated for the fund would increase by 2.5% each year and the override would cost the average household about \$50.

Why am I writing about this override vote? The stabilization fund would pay to advance and expand the wireless infrastructure in all the schools. Currently, the wireless infrastructure at WHS can barely support all of the faculty laptops. The network is slow and, at times, the internet and email are down, greatly hindering the work of the administrative staff and the faculty. Teacher lesson plans frequently integrate the use of their laptops, LCD projectors, interactive whiteboards, and the internet. When the internet is down, many important activities grind to a halt.

A robust wireless infrastructure would allow all of the schools to go 1:1, meaning each student would be able to bring a laptop or tablet into the building and be able to access the wireless network. Many high schools already have this capability and 1:1 is transforming teaching and learning. Last year WHS had a 1:1 committee that explored and advocated for WHS going 1:1. The committee's frustration was that the town did not have a revenue source to fund the upgrade of the infrastructure. The new stabilization fund would provide that source and would finance infrastructure improvement, not salaries or hardware. A new and improved wireless infrastructure (that is unlikely to go down) will allow our teachers to further integrate technology into instruction without the worries of an inconsistent network. Students will be able to use their electronic devices in school to enhance their learning.

FOUR PUBLIC HEARINGS ON THE RENOVATION OF THE WINCHESTER HIGH SCHOOL

Don't Miss Out! Early this month, the MSBA approved Winchester's moving forward with the preferred plan to have a full renovation with additional space at the current site of the high school. The EFPBC will be working in partnership with the School Committee and Board of Selectmen to complete the final “schematic” (25%) design and determine an estimate by late July/August. Four public gatherings are currently scheduled to provide residents an opportunity to see updated plans, understand the costs associated with the project, and hear more about why a renovation is necessary. Please plan to attend the next Winchester High School public hearing scheduled for **Tuesday, April 30th at the High School Auditorium at 7pm**. Other scheduled information sessions include: Sunday, May 19th hosted by the League of Women Voters, June 19th hosted by the EFPBC, and tentatively July 24th. Also, look for the EFPBC to have a booth at Town Day this year as well as some information tables at a few athletic games this spring. 2013-2014 Course Selection

All freshmen, sophomores, and juniors met with their counselors last month to complete course selection for the next school year. All students should have a "green" course selection sheet which confirms their requests. Please note these are requests NOT final schedules. Student schedules are built over the summer. There are many factors which determine a student's schedule including but not limited to: course availability, meeting course pre-requisites, class size, and the impact of other courses on a student's schedule. 2013-2014 schedules will be available on Edline in August.

Important Reminder: Please complete the **Counselor Report Form** and **Parent Brag Sheet** in *Naviance* by June 1st. Guidance Counselors use this form to write secondary school report that goes out to every college you apply to next year. Please go to: <http://connection.naviance.com/winchester> and log into your account to complete the survey under the "About me" tab. If you don't remember your account, email your guidance counselor and we will provide you with your information.

Please Note: For security reasons, Naviance is designed to sign you out automatically if your session is inactive for 45 minutes. If you are

signed out in less than 45 minutes or if your session ends unexpectedly while you are actively using the system, it is likely that a small file written to your computer while you use Naviance known as a “session cookie” has become corrupted or that your school is using a proxy server that is ending your session. To address this issue, you should first delete cookies on your computer and clear the cache your browser keeps of the sites you visit. In most cases, completing these steps resolves any issues relating to sessions ending prematurely.

Final Transcripts for Class of 2013

SENIOR SURVEY

Seniors will be meeting with their guidance counselor the first week of May to complete the annual *Senior Survey* in Naviance. Seniors should log-in to their Naviance accounts and click on “Graduation Survey”. The survey asks seniors to indicate to which college or post-secondary institution they want their final transcript sent, as well as to provide the results of the colleges’ decisions on their other applications. Seniors are required to complete this *Senior Survey* as part of their graduation requirements before receiving their caps and gowns.

The Guidance Department is aware that plans do change. A number of seniors pay a deposit to one college to hold a space for next fall, but choose to remain on a waiting list at a second college. Graduates are asked to notify the Guidance Office immediately if they wish to change the college to which their final transcript will be sent.

Vacancy Lists Keep College Option Open

Current seniors or past graduates who may have postponed the college application process for a

variety of reasons should know that it’s not too late to apply to college for next fall. Two organizations compile vacancy lists of colleges that are still accepting students for Fall 2013. The New England Board of Higher Education (NEBHE) maintains a list of New England colleges and universities that still have openings. Students may visit www.nebhe.org to view this list in mid-to-late May. The National Association for College Admission Counseling posts its Annual Space Availability Survey on its website, www.nacacnet.org/space to assist college counseling professionals working with students who have not completed the college admission process. This annual survey indicates openings not only in Fall 2013 freshman classes, but also openings for transfer students, as well as the availability of financial aid and campus housing.

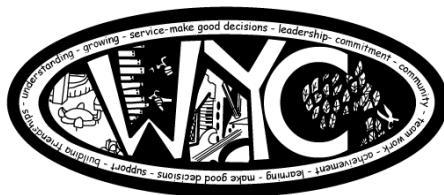
