WPS TEST & STAY PROGRAM

The Winchester Public Schools (WPS) is implementing a COVID-19 testing program in coordination with the Department of Elementary & Secondary Education (DESE). The main goal of this program is to provide an extra layer of protection in preventing the spread of COVID-19. We strongly encourage participation as a way to help keep our students healthy and in school throughout the year.

This program has 2 components, which you can find at the links below:

<u>Test and Stay</u> for students who have been exposed while in school but are not showing symptoms.

<u>COVID-19 safety checks</u>: Weekly surveillance testing of asymptomatic students and staff

Why should students and staff participate?

- It will help minimize the spread of COVID-19 and keep our students in school
- The more students who participate, the more our community will be protected
- All tests are non-invasive, short nasal swabs or saliva samples
- There is no cost to you

Only one consent form is needed to participate in these testing programs

Test & Stay Rollout

We will begin the roll out of the Test and Stay Program on a limited basis this week. This testing program is optional; however, please know that if you choose to opt-out of testing, it may result in your child missing school due to having to quarantine if identified as an in-school close contact. You will be contacted directly if your child qualifies for this program.

COVID-19 Symptoms

If a student or a staff member is exhibiting COVID-19 Symptoms:

If a WPS student or staff member exhibits any COVID-19 symptoms <u>WPS Symptom Checker</u> they are required to stay home. Parents/guardians or staff will be required to provide the school nurse with a negative PCR Test result or MD/NP note with an alternate diagnosis AND must be fever free for 24 hours and symptoms must be much improved, to be cleared to return to school.

***NOTE:** per our health department and MA DPH, WPS nurses will not accept home COVID-19 test results.

COVID-19 Protocols

We understand the importance of regular communication regarding COVID-19 information and data, which we will provide in several ways throughout the continuation of the pandemic: (1) School <u>close</u> <u>contacts</u> are identified through contact tracing by Winchester Public School Nurses and the Winchester Health Department contact tracers. Close contacts will typically be notified within 24 hours of identification; (2) Our new <u>WPS Dashboard</u> is now available and is where you can find positive case counts by school, updated at least once a week (Fridays), and (3) The Town of Winchester's

COVID-19 Dashboard is where you can find town-wide case counts, regional and state comparisons, as well as vaccination and testing information.

As we have previously shared, WPS will be offering a free and voluntary COVID-19 testing program for PreK-12. Testing will allow us to maintain in-person learning while ensuring that everyone is safe at school. We strongly encourage students and staff to participate. What are the benefits?

Keep Kids and Staff Safe: catch cases before they spread to other students and staff; Keep our Schools Open: prevent further time away from in-person learning and friends; Stop the Spread: prevent infecting another member of your household or community.

This Friday you will receive more details, including a link to a new WPS COVID-19 Testing Website, as well as registration information for the Test and Stay Program for students who have been identified as close contacts

to a COVID-19 positive individual while in school, but who are not showing symptoms.

Vaccination is a critical tool in keeping our students, staff, and community safe from COVID-19. Individuals who are vaccinated against COVID-19 are less likely to develop severe illness. Persons 12 years of age or older are eligible for vaccination. If you have not been vaccinated it is not too late! Please speak with your healthcare provider. You can also call your local pharmacy or visit <u>MA vaccination locations</u>.

Finally, please make sure you are using the <u>Daily Symptom Checker</u> prior to sending your children to school, and do not forget to print & sign a copy of the

<u>WPS Student Illness form</u> and return to your student's school nurse by September 15th.

The Winchester Soccer Club TOPS program provides children with different abilities the opportunity to play soccer through rule and equipment adaptation. This adaptive program invites athletes ages 5+ to participate in a modified game of soccer once a week. The program is run by Winchester Soccer Club in collaboration with the Winchester Recreation Department.

Winchester Soccer Club volunteers called "Junior Coaches" are matched with a player during each session. The Junior Coaches will incorporate a

few formal activities to encourage learning of soccer but the goal of each session is for the coach and player to make a connection and have fun together. The Junior Coaches are Winchester students in grades 8-12. No specific training and no prior soccer experience is required. Junior coaching is a great opportunity to connect with TOPS players and provide them with an opportunity to participate in an athletic activity and to have fun! WSC organizers will be on hand to help.

The Fall 2021 program runs **Sundays, September 19th - November 14th** (no session on Sunday, October 10) from 12:00-1:00 p.m. at Skillings turf field.

Church St at Waterfield Rd: Reconstruction of the intersection of Church St and Waterfield Rd will begin in late September or early October and continue through Fall 2021. The project includes traffic calming measures and improved pedestrian and bike facilities.


Eversource 115kV Project: Eversource will be continuing construction on the 115kV line through Fall 2021. Work will be focused primarily in the Bacon St corridor between Church St and Symmes Corner, and on Main St between Stowell Rd and the Medford line. Detours in this area are expected. https://www.winchester.us/505/115kV-Line-Mystic-to-Woburn

Eversource 345kV Project: Eversource will be continuing construction on the 345kV line through Fall 2021. Crews will be working on Washington St in the area between the Aberjona River bridge and Cross St. https://www.winchester.us/506/345kV-Line-Woburn-to-Wakefield

Swanton Street Bridge Flood Mitigation: Reconstruction of the Swanton St bridge will be on-going into Fall 2021. The road is closed to through traffic, but is open to the Transfer Station from the eastern (Washington St) side.

Crafters Wanted


The Christmas Fair at the Parish of the Epiphany is on Saturday, November 20. We invite all crafters to join the fun as a vendor at the Fair. It's a
