COVID-19 UPDATE

Dear Winchester Students and Families,

We hope you had a wonderful break and a Happy New Year!

We expect some challenges over the next few weeks with the increase in COVID-19 cases in our community. We should all be proud of how we have worked together to keep each other as safe as possible. Still, as a school community, we need to stay vigilant as we once again deal with rising COVID-19 cases within Winchester and across the Commonwealth.

Since the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year, we have maintained and strengthened those layered mitigation strategies that we know work, both from

medical experts and from our own experience. Additionally, our nurses, administration, teachers, and staff have done a tremendous job keeping the safety and health of students and staff at the heart of all that we have done. In addition to universal masking, we made some decisions earlier this year that have allowed us to keep everyone in school and learning, including:

- Physical distancing as practicable in classrooms and learning spaces;
- Through the Town of Winchester Facilities Department, continued to ensure the proper operation and maintenance of our HVAC systems, enhancing air exchange and purification with HEPA filtration units in the majority of our buildings;
- Utilizing multiple spaces for serving lunches, including gymnasiums and other large spaces so that we can maximize distancing when students are most vulnerable for transmission: when their masks are off;
- Getting our students outside whenever possible, including allowing all WHS students to participate in an open campus environment at lunch;
- Communication with you with new tools, such as ParentSquare, our <u>COVID</u> and <u>Test and Stay</u> website content, and our <u>COVID-19</u> <u>Dashboard</u>.
- Scheduled all public and large group meetings remotely
- Conduct all large staff meetings remotely in January;

New this year, thanks to the incredible work of our school nurses and Town Health Department:

- Implementation of the State's Test and Stay program, which has saved HUNDREDS of students HUNDREDS of days of school;
- Utilization of regular surveillance testing for those students and families who have given us their consent to test regularly to help manage COVID-19 transmission and given us valuable data for mitigation adjustments. This testing will once again be in full effect beginning tomorrow.

And we are grateful to all of you, who have taken the MOST IMPORTANT step in helping us stay healthy: keeping your students home when they have been symptomatic. Our success is yours, and now we need each other more than ever!

As we return tomorrow, we face some expected challenges with the rise COVID-19 positive cases; however, our administrators are working hard to

ensure that we have the coverage we need to keep our students safe and learning. Please stay in touch with your building principal and remain alert for any updates from us over the coming days.

Finally, please see the updated **quarantine and isolation guidelines**. We will continue to work with families through these new CDC changes, as they are complicated.

Please remember to monitor your student(s) for symptoms and keep your student(s) home if they show any symptoms or are not feeling well (Daily Symptom Checker).

TEST FOR COVID-19! If positive: notify your close contacts and stay home!

Important tools to limit the spread of COVID, and especially important to protect vulnerable members of our community:

- GET A BOOSTER SHOT IF QUALIFY!
- WEAR A MASK: effective way to stop the spread of COVID.
 - It is strongly advised that everyone wear masks indoors in public settings.
- STAY HOME IF SICK: Stay away from others and if test positive, notify your close contacts.
- TEST: Before gathering with friends and family, traveling, or if you have symptoms. Go to an official testing site or take a home test.

(Note: Home tests have limitations. For school attendance purposes, official testing site results are required when students/staff are showing symptoms of COVID-19).

IMPORTANT STUDENT PARKING INFORMATION

Students are reminded that they are ONLY to park in the student parking lot. Any students parked on Skillings Road in teacher spots, in any of the teacher lots, or anywhere else not designated as student parking, are subject to ticketing and potential loss of their parking permit.

As a reminder, juniors and seniors wishing to park in the student lot must complete this <u>online form</u> to register for a parking pass.

TARDY PROCEDURE

As a reminder, it is expected that students are **in class ready to learn** when the 8:30 AM bell rings. Students should aim to arrive at school no later than 8:25, so that they have time to travel to their class. Students unexcused tardy to school are prohibited from participating in extracurricular activities (including athletics) on that day. Excessive tardiness places a student at a great disadvantage and disrupts the learning environment.

Any student with 6 or more unexcused tardies (please see the <u>school handbook</u> for what constitutes an excused absence or tardy) in a quarter may lose their ability to access our open campus during that day's lunch block, or receive an afternoon or morning detention for each successive tardy. If the tardiness continues or the student fails to report for their assigned quiet lunch or detention then progressive disciplinary action will occur.

VOCATIONAL PROGRAM OPPORTUNITY

Northeast Metropolitan Regional Vocational School will again be offering a free Saturday Exploratory program open to all students in participating towns. The 4-week program is offered in 3 sessions (January, February and March) and students have the option of participating in all 3.

Programs include automotive technology, carpentry, cosmetology, culinary arts, dental assisting, CAD, design, electrical, fabrication, plumbing and robotics.



GIRLS BASKETBALL



SENDING GRADE REPORTS TO COLLEGES

Seniors wishing to have Q1 grades sent to schools must complete the Q1 Grade request Form.

Please note:

Naviance no longer allows report cards to be sent to individual schools so students making requests for grades need to be aware that they will be sent to all schools that the student applies to regardless of when they apply (but will never download to any schools until an application is submitted). Requests are processed in the order in which they were received. Mid Year Averages for all classes are automatically shared to all schools which students apply to (no request needed).

Students who are thinking of attending college in the fall need to fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to be eligible for federal, state, and local financial aid.
