#### "PLAYS IT FORWARD" PAYS IT FORWARD!

All too often, news stations across the nation and various social media outlets highlight stories of high school students making questionable choices and otherwise bad decisions. We don't hear frequently enough about the students who strive to make a difference in our world each and every day. This is one of those stories.

A group of current Winchester High School student-athletes created a small committee entitled "Plays it Forward." This group of committed high school students arranged for sporting equipment drives in order to raise charitable funds for youth programs around the globe with the mission to "help provide as many as possible with the opportunity to play the sports they love."

Recently, as you may have heard, a local youth sports team, the Winchester Pop Warner Adaptive team of athletes was invited to exhibit their routine on the national stage in December. With such an invitation comes exorbitant expenses including travel and lodging for the athletes, a parent, coaches and the adaptive athletes student helpers consisting of local WHS and Medford high school students.

It is here that the two organizations merge. The "Plays it Forward" Committee of WHS student-athletes and former Winchester Pop Warner athletes presented the WPW Adaptive Team and student demos with a check for \$1000 last evening to help make their national debut a reality. The committee congratulated the WPW Adaptive Team on both their hard work and their success and wished them well at the Pop Warner Nationals taking place next week in Orlando, Florida.

A heartfelt thank you to the "Plays it Forward" Committee made up of a number of former WPW athletes including Claire Book, Jack Centurelli, Aidan Falvey, Niko Fortier, Sofia Wilson, Tom Centurelli, Colin Falvey, Will Fortier, and Ben Wilson. ### LATIN CLUB TAKES FIRST PLACE

The WHS Latin Club recently participated in Classics Day at Boston University, an annual event attended by high schools throughout Massachusetts. Students enjoyed workshops, lunch, assemblies and a dramatic competition. WHS students won 1st place for their original, student-written skit on this year's theme, "Diversity in Antiquity."



### **NEW TARDY PROCEDURE**

We have a significant and increasing number of students who arrive at school each day after the 8:30 am start of school bell. As a reminder, it is expected that students are in class ready to learn when the 8:30 bell rings. Students unexcused tardy to school are prohibited from participating in extracurricular activities (including athletics) on that day. Excessive tardiness places a student at a great disadvantage and disrupts the learning environment. In order to help prevent these disruptions, WHS is enacting a new tardy procedure. Any student with 6 or more unexcused tardies (please see the **school handbook** for what constitutes an excused absence or tardy) in a quarter will lose their ability to access our open campus policy during that day's lunch block for day each tardy. The student will automatically be assigned to have a quiet, phone-free lunch in C111 on that day. Students will have time to access the cafeteria to acquire food. If the tardiness continues or the student fails to report for their assigned quiet lunch, progressive disciplinary action will occur.

#### FROM THE NURSES OFFICE

We are thrilled to announce that we are rolling out weekly COVID-19 safety checks to WHS students, to keep our school and community healthy.

This will be a take-home PCR nasal swab test. Both vaccinated and unvaccinated students can participate.


Requests are processed in the order in which they were received.
