School Lunches

Did you know that the USDA has approves **FREE** breakfast and lunch for **ALL** students for schools on the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program for the 20-21 school year!

COST to parents. Meals are approved to be served both IN PERSON and for PICK UP. Students attending school in person are eligible to pick up breakfast and lunch daily at NO CHARGE (1 breakfast and 1 lunch).


