From the WHS School Nurses

We are seeing an uptick of cases in our community and the WHS nurses are working tirelessly to follow-up on all absences and emails, but we need the support and follow-through of our families. We want to keep seeing our students in our WHS Building. Please continue to stay vigilant.

School Absences:

It is very important to our collective health that everyone in our school community reviews the Covid-19 **Daily Symptom checker** and stays home if they are feeling ill/are exhibiting any of the potential symptoms.

Including:

- Fever (temperature of 100.0 deg F or above), felt feverish, or had chills
- Cough (not due to other known cause, such as chronic cough)
- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Headache when in combination with other symptoms
- Muscle aches or body aches
- Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
- Fatigue when in combination with other symptoms
- Nasal congestion or runny nose (not due to other known causes, such as allergies) when in combination with other symptoms

If your student is home sick due to Covid-19 symptoms, you must provide documentation of a **Negative Covid-19 PCR test** and be cleared to return to school by a WHS Nurse before your student can return to school. Official test results can be faxed or emailed directly to one of the nurses using the email links below. Parents/Guardians must have communication with a school nurse via phone or email that states your child is cleared to come back to school. Additionally, students must be fever free for at least 24 hours without Tylenol or Motrin and all other symptoms significantly improved.

Travel:

If you must travel, it is your responsibility to follow the **Mass Travel**Order. When traveling to a high risk area, please notify the WHS health office and submit a Negative PCR test before your student can return to the building. Please plan your trip accordingly.

Masks:

We are pleased with our students and their willingness to help keep our community safer by wearing masks when on our WHS school campus. Please be sure to wear a clean mask everyday, wash cloth masks every night, adequately cover your mouth and nose and, if your mask becomes wet or soiled during the school day, please see the front office staff for a new clean mask.

Have a child returning home from college?

If yes, make a plan for their safe re-entry back to Winchester. Even if your child had a negative test before coming home, this does not mean they are COVID-19 free. Take precautions within your household and be on the lookout COVID-19 symptoms.



Student coming home from college (excluding low risk states)

Complete a MA Travel Form AND

Either have a negative PCR
 COVID-19* TEST within 72 hours
 before returning home/when home
 OR quarantine at home for 14 days.

\$500 fine per day for failure to comply
*Positive PCR COVID-19 test will be managed by
Health Department


Parent picking student up** and staying >24 hours (excluding low risk states)

**Parent driving student home and anyone else in car should wear a mask and open car windows to create airflow

Precautions to consider for 14 days after return home	How to Stop the Spread
STAY HOME	Practice social distancing and wash hands frequently
Wear a mask (even indoors at home)	Wear a mask with anyone outside your household, even outdoors. The State updated face-covering order to include all public places, at all times.
Create distance during meals (eat outside when possible); sit at opposite ends of the table; open windows to create airflow	If need to ride in a car with someone outside your household wear a mask and open car windows for airflow
Sleep in a separate room. Use a separate bathroom and disinfect any shared bathrooms after every use.	No parties! Large gatherings are not safe indoors or outdoors (including Fells/wooded areas). The State announced 10pm curfew and reduced social gathering numbers: details here

- The En Ka Pantry is open to all households, through pre-arranged appointments.




