The above topics represent what the Chair of the Winchester School Committee reasonably anticipates will be discussed at this meeting at the time this meeting was posted.

### **COVID UPDATE**

Winchester is currently experiencing a COVID-19 surge, as is Middlesex County and most of the state. Transmission is high, and indoor settings pose the greatest risk.

Don't assume if you have a stuffy nose or scratchy throat that it is a cold or allergies; it may be COVID-19. A positive result may take several days before showing up on an antigen test, so it is highly advisable to retest for multiple days if you test negative with even mild symptoms.

We are STRONGLY recommending the following to slow the spread and to avoid missed school days and end of year activities:

**MASK UP INDOORS:** Especially at all times in school buildings and public places when not eating. While this is not a mandate, it is a highly effective tool to protect yourself and others against COVID-19.

Remember, masking is still REQUIRED if able to return to school on Days 6-10 after isolation after you have had a known exposure to a positive person (including household members)

**TEST:** Stay home if positive. Home antigen tests indicate active infection. Test (more than once) if you have any symptoms. Tests are available through the Health Department and your school nurse.

**VACCINATE:** Stay up to date on COVID-19 vaccinations. Check the town's webpage for any upcoming clinics held by the Health Department.

Boosters for 5-11yo coming soon!

Return to school after testing positive for COVID-19/isolation:

A Health Department case manager will call to discuss the return of a student. The student must be symptom-free and able to mask at all times except for eating in order to return. We ask that you also take a home antigen test on Day 5 or later, prior to returnl and if positive, t is strongly advised that if you remain home. Return to school questions?

Call the Health Department 781-721-7121.

We are so close to the end of school.

Thank you for your cooperation in making these last few weeks of school as healthy as possible!

### **WPS COVID-19**

ALL positive COVID-19 test results should now be submitted via **this form** (regardless of whether the test was taken at home or through a clinic). This is required to determine your student's clearance date for returning to school.

- You do not need to contact your school nurse
- Please remember to report your student absent as you normally would
- While isolation guidance for COVID-19 has been shortened to 5 days if you never had symptoms or if symptoms have resolved, it is your responsibility to monitor your students and keep them home longer to recover, if needed




### FRENCH CLUB
