FREE SCHOOL MEALS EXTENDED FOR ALL STUDENTS (2022-2023)

As you may know, it was recently announced that the Commonwealth of Massachusetts will extend free school meals for all students through the 2022-2023 school year. While breakfast and lunch will continue to be served at no cost to all students, second meals and a la carte items (i.e, milk) will be charged to student accounts at existing prices. To add funds to your student's account, please visit <u>https://www.myschoolbucks.com</u> or submit a payment via a check made payable to Winchester School Lunch Program to any cashier at each school.

Please note that even though meals will be free for all, it is very important for families to complete the household Application for

Free and Reduced Price Meals for the 2022-2023 school year. You can view and complete the application <u>here</u>.

We strongly encourage ALL families to submit this form as it allows us to establish eligibility for P-EBT benefits, waived transportation fees for those who qualify, and serve families most effectively.




