
Welcome back from vacation!

MANDATORY MASKING IN EFFECT

This is just a reminder that mandatory masking is still in place for students, faculty, and staff upon our return to school on Monday, February 28th.

DESE's lifting of the statewide mandate allows school systems to move to optional masking. While every community is different, many cities and towns established local masking mandates and negotiated requirements into contractual agreements with teachers' associations and other unions that remain in effect until modified/removed through bargaining. As communicated in the WPS email prior to the vacation week, the WPS is in discussions with the Winchester Educators' Association (WEA) regarding the transition to optional masking.

PARKING REMINDERS

Students are reminded that they may ONLY park in the student lot. Students parked in other places (visitor parking, staff spots, unauthorized spots on Skillings Road) are subject to ticketing. Repeat offenders may have their parking pass revoked.

Students are ALSO reminded to use the trash receptacles in the parking lot. Please do not just leave your trash on the ground.

MORNING DROP OFF REMINDERS

For everyone's safety and to help facilitate a better morning traffic flow with student drop offs, we ask that all families who drop off students, to please drive as far up through the traffic circle toward the stop sign. Please do not drop off on the corner as you pull in. Please do not drop off in the crosswalk area. Please pull up as far as possible and have your student(s) wait until it is safe to get out of the car.

WPS COVID-19

ALL positive COVID-19 test results should now be submitted via this form (regardless of whether the test was taken at home or through a clinic). This is required to determine your student's clearance date for returning to school.

- You do not need to contact your school nurse
- Please remember to report your student absent as you normally would
- While isolation guidance for COVID-19 has been shortened to 5 days if you never had symptoms or if symptoms have resolved, it is your responsibility to monitor your students and keep them home longer to recover, if needed

COVID TESTING IN WINCHESTER

Get tested after February vacation week at Winchester Town Hall.

Two testing clinics;

Monday, February 28th from 2:30pm to 4:30pm and Wednesday, March 2 from 4pm to 6pm.

Test clinic is \$20 per test if you are not a Town employee. You need to register through Project Beacon with a Town of Winchester Profile (code "WINTESTING") and you can create that here. Testing is recommended for symptomatic individuals, if you are exposed to someone positive (e.g. if someone in your house is positive), and before visiting with high risk individuals. PLEASE CANCEL YOUR APPOINTMENT IN ADVANCE IF YOU ARE UNABLE TO ATTEND.
